Therefore, the challenge for researchers in elite youth sports is to ensure that practices we pursue with our young charges promote their health and well-being and that sports is for the benefit of the athlete and not the other way around.

On August 11, 1948, the United States Postal Service offered “Saluting Young America,” a first day of issue stamp honoring “Youth Month” which was to be observed in the month of September.

The Finances of Youth Sports in the United States The landscape of the youth sports world is markedly different than it was a few decades ago. The cost of youth sports is much higher today than ever before, but the cost is just as much emotional as it is fiscal.

Nearly 30 million children and adolescents participate in youth sports just in the United States. This high rise in sport participation has led to some startling statistics, high school athletes account for an estimated 2 million injuries, 500,000 doctor visits, and 30,000 hospitalizations each year.
